


Advanced Pattern—Not for Beginners



A Patrolman's Star Quilt Top- by Rochelle Holland

Do not use the above photo to sew the quilt-top. Follow the instructions below and use the diagram on page three. This pattern is not recommended for beginners; however, a beginner with patience will be able to sew this pattern.

***Please note that the fabric recommendations below are for 8 ½ half-square triangles.**

Checklist

Write color on the line.

- 1 ½ Yards of fabric: 32 - Color 1 (C1) half square triangles _____
- ½ Yard of fabric: 8 -Color 2 (C2) half square triangles _____
- ½ Yard of fabric 8 - Color 3 (C3) half square triangles _____
- 1 Yard of fabric: 16 half square triangles of Accent 1 (A1)-_____
- ¼ Yard of fabric: 4 half square triangles of Accent 2 – (A2) _____
- ¼ Yard of fabric: 4 half square triangles of Accent 3-(A3) _____

Advanced Pattern—Not for Beginners

Create 36 Finished Squares made from Triangles by sewing $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seams.

CHECKLIST for Finished Squares.

- 4- Color 1 Finished Squares
- 4 –Color 1 and Color 2 Finished Squares
- 4- Color 1 and Color 3 Finished Squares
- 4- Color 2 and Color 3 Finished Squares
- 12-Color 1 and Accent 1 Finished Squares
- 2 –Color 1 and Accent 2 Finished Squares
- 2-Color 1 and Accent 3 Finished Squares
- 2-Accent 1 and Accent 2 Finished Squares
- 2-Accent 1 and Accent 3 finished Squares

Instructions: After your finished 36 squares are sewn, sew rows together by matching the square blocks using the correct angle, and then sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam. I recommend sewing Row 1a and Row 2a blocks together and continue with that method until you get to 1F and 2F, then start the next two rows. The red lines will help keep your eyes focused on the two rows you’re sewing. Then sew the three completed rows together. After all rows are sewn together, add borders to make a 50X50 quilt, and then quilt.
